Bastille Day Auction

On Saturday 14th July 2007 the vicinity of Broad Bay Community Centre was a hive of activity as willing workers converted the Hall into a French Café for the Bastille Day fund-raising auction. Tables and comfortable chairs were moved in, crisp white cloths, red and blue serviettes, balloons, streamers, sound systems, food, drink, French posters, and a huge French flag. It was *fantastique* to see everyone working together to bring this transformation about.

Despite competition from the weather, the rugby, the netball AND the ball up the hill, the event was attended by about 90 people. Everyone was in a merry mood - aided no doubt by the free glasses of wine and beer given to ticket holders, and the delicious continuous supper - nibbles, French bread (of course), cheeses, dips, savouries, cream cakes, chocolate and coffee.

People were extremely generous with donations of goods and services for the auction. Over 70 individuals and businesses contributed, and that is not counting the kind people who donated their time and energy to help with the organisation of the event and on the night.

Goods auctioned ranged from the smelly (bags of horse poo for the garden) to the sublime (for example, a beautifully illustrated, two-volume copy of the award-winning Audrey Eagle's "Trees and Shrubs of New Zealand"). Services included relaxing massages and possum trapping! During the evening, several spot prizes were awarded, and raffles were held for items such as a trailer of firewood, a food hamper, and a beautiful hand-made child's quilt.

Bidding was fast and furious, and our wonderful auctioneer, Ross Wellgreen, did a magnificent job keeping the bids coming, aided by his beautiful beret-clad assistant, Shrpesa (who, as well as displaying the goods, also put her hand up a few times!) During a break from the fierce bidding, musical entertainment was provided by Neville Peat and Adrian Higgins, giving the audience a chance to unwind - and to top up their glasses!

The event was very successful, raising well over \$6,000 for our Community Hall, which will keep us up and running for some time to come.

The Broad Bay Community Centre owes a huge vote of thanks to everyone who donated goods and services, to the people who helped to organise and run the event and last, but by no means least, to those who supported us by attending, enjoying (and bidding at!) the Bastille Day auction.

MoU

The Community Centre Committee has finalised its copy of the memorandum for the joint venture with the BBBC. The next step will be for the two sub-committees to meet again and decide on the final form of this MoU which is satisfactory to both parties. Once it is signed off by the two parties, elections can be held amongst the two parties for a joint body which can then fund a viability study - ie, is the building envisaged down beside the harbour, on the site of the BBBC's boatshed a viable proposition. If you want to vote in these elections, or nominate likely members for the joint body, you need to be a member of either the Community Centre or the BBBC.
